Italy does not have a general expectation that consumers must tip, however you are welcome to do so.



The authorized taxis by the Municipality are white with a "TAXI" sign on the roof of the car. The Taxis' licensing number can be seen on the doors. Taxis can be found outside Terminals 1 and 3 of Leonardo da Vinci Airport.

Private car with driver, Tonucci has special rates with the Blue Car Service
(info@ncc-roma.com phone: +39 06 41735491; +39 3483590089), you can book directly with them mentioning that you are using the special rate Tonucci & Partners. The cost will be €40,75 from the Leonardo da Vinci Airport to the center, or from the center to the airport €38,50. Should you be arriving at the Ciampino Rome's second Airport the cost will be €38,50. Usually payments by credit cards are accepted but please check in advance with the driver.

Priorities:



Airport Transfers Rome-Fiumicino Leonardo da Vinci International Airport is 32 km from the center of Rome. The fastest way, it takes 31 minutes from the Airport to the center of Rome is the train Leonardo Express. It runs directly from the Airport to the Rome Termini Station. From there you can move by taking a taxi or the Metropolitan transportation to reach your final destination. Rome's second Airport Rome Ciampino is 15 km from the Rome's Town Center it is well served principally by Bus or Taxi they are no trains. A taxi is the most comfortable form of transportation, it takes roughly about 30 mins depending on the time of day. The cost is between €30/€40.

By Bus, the Company Atral runs a service between the Ciampino Airport and the Metropolitan Station Anagnina. From there you can use the Metro A.



Uber

In Rome Uber services are limited to UberBlack, UberLux e UberVan. Check for details on your Uber App.



Smoking

Smoking is not allowed in all indoor facilities, unless smoking areas are foreseen.

Roma Barocca

From the Spanish Steps to the spectacular Trevi Fountain, on to the amazing architecture of the Pantheon, and the lively atmosphere of Piazza Navona, with the Fountain of the Four Rivers by Bernini.

Colosseo, Fori Imperiali and Campidoglio

The Flavian Amphitheater, better known as the Colosseum is among the most popular sites in Rome and one of the most visited sites in the world. Completed in 80 A.D., and able to accommodate up to 50,000 spectators, the Colosseum is an iconic symbol of the Roman Empire, was used for gladiatorial combat until 435 A.D.


The Colosseum Archaeological Park also includes the Roman Forum located on the slopes of the Capitol, Palatine and Esquiline. In it we find the most significant testimonies of the political and religious history of the ancient city. Along the Via Sacra took place the triumphal processions granted by the Senate to those generals who had distinguished themselves during the military campaigns.

The Piazza del Campidoglio, paved at the end of the 7th century BC, became the heart of public life in the city for over a millennium.




